1.0 Purpose

The scope of education provided at the Wasatch Waldorf Charter School does not stop with the "Three R's," of reading, writing, and arithmetic but extends into the student's environment as they attend school. We wish to surround the child with an environment that allows our students to develop and flourish.

2.0 Definition

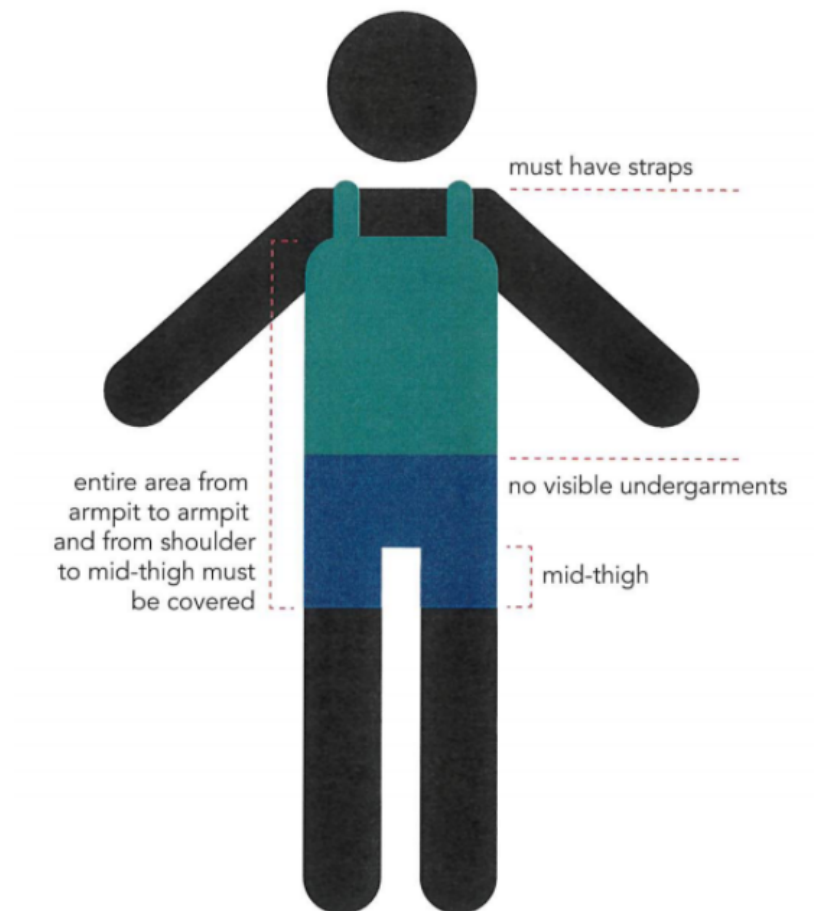
Our goal is to develop a healthy school-time environment by guiding children toward appropriate school attire. This policy may not cover all situations and teachers may have special need to address particular attire. Please contact your class teacher(s) if you have any questions about specific articles of clothing.

3.0 Policy Content

Parental support is needed and appreciated in the following areas.

1. To ensure a safe environment for our children, have them:
 - a. Come well dressed for the weather and/or come anticipating the weather.
 - b. Come wearing comfortable, practical, flat-soled shoes that are firmly attached to the feet.
 - c. Come wearing attire that will allow the student to actively participate in all school related activities.
 - d. Come wearing attire that meets the coverage standards in the attached image. This includes:
 - i. Tops that have straps
 - ii. No visible undergarments

- iii. Coverage of the entire area from armpit to armpit and from shoulder to mid-thigh



- 2. To create an environment focused on learning and which provides a wholesome social atmosphere, the children shall wear

- a. Clothing and accessories free of printed messages, pictures or images. Examples of acceptable clothing includes patterns, plaids, stripes, solids, or school-approved Wasatch Waldorf Charter School logo-wear.
 - b. Shoes free of lights and/or wheels.
- 3. Children shall not wear:
 - a. Hoods or hats indoors.
 - b. Outdoor boots or coats in the classroom.
 - c. Dangling jewelry (including necklaces, earrings, etc.)
 - d. Watches or other devices that have computing capacity.
 - e. Hair dyed colors that are not naturally occurring for human hair..

Students shall also only bring items to school, including lunchboxes and backpacks, that are free from printed messages, pictures, and images.
