

Supplement, Not Supplant Policy Adopted: 2/24/21 Revised: Version: 1

1.0 Purpose

Supplement, Not Supplant Policy and Procedures describe how Wasatch Waldorf Charter School (School) ensures that federal funds are used only to supplement, and not supplant, state and local funds that would, in the absence of federal funds, be spent on federal programs

Federal funds may not take the place (or supplant) public education services that are to be provided to all students. The policy and procedure below demonstrates how the School uses federal funds only to supplement, and to the extent practical, increase the level of funds that would, in the absence of federal funds, be made available from non-federal sources for the education of children participating in federal programs.

2.0 Supplanting

To avoid the presumption of supplanting with Federal funds, Wasatch Charter School will ensure that:

- Federal funds are not used to supplant expenditures that were required to be made available under other state or local laws; and
- Federal funds are not used to supplant expenditures made with non-federal funds in prior years; and
- Federal funds are not used to provide services to participating children [i.e., Title I students], if those same services were provided with non-federal funds to non-participating children.

3.0 Exclusions and Rebuttals

The School may exclude supplemental state or local funds expended for programs that meet the intent and purposes of the federal program. The presumption of supplanting can be rebutted if the School demonstrates it would not have provided services if the federal funds were not available.
